
Each of our hospitals is supported by a League of Friends; these are independent registered charities which work to help provide equipment and resources to improve patient care and comfort along with volunteers.

Friends of York Hospital

The Friends of York Hospital have kindly funded a patient newspaper entitled 'Wonderful World' to engage patients, staff and visitors within our hospitals. The Arts Team recently worked with local artist Dan Savage to create the newspaper which has proven to be very popular.

The nature based newspaper is used for activity and distraction, bringing the outside in and was inspired by the 'Boredom Buster' newspaper – which was produced with the National Arts in Hospital Network to give patients an activity to do during Covid. Staff suggested producing a paper internally that would serve patients with local nature-based themes to help alleviate anxiety and boost mood. Staff also noted that the interactive pages encouraged creativity and conversation with visitors and patients.

One thousand newspapers have been printed and many given out to patients to mark the launch of the Arts Team's new 'Wonderful World' Creative Health Framework.



The difference you've made

Complementary therapy for cancer patients

Patients receiving auricular acupuncture in the Cancer Care Centre at York Hospital can now relax in one of two therapy chairs, thanks to your donations.

Michelle Kirkman and Sue Blanchard, NADA trained complementary therapists within Cancer Services, approached the charity as they each required a specialised chair to carry out the treatment which is designed to help with symptomatic and emotional relief associated with a cancer diagnosis.

Louise Rhodes was part of the original patient group who experienced the therapy and trialled the charitably funded chairs.



She told us that having the opportunity to be referred into the complementary therapy team was a 'godsend' to her, as it enables people experiencing challenging symptoms, including pain, anxiety, and fatigue, to receive support that is very much needed, in a safe, comfortable environment.



Ultrasound machine for Ward 16

Thanks to your donations we have been able to fund an ultrasound machine for Ward 16 at York Hospital. Used by medical staff and Surgical Care Practitioners for the insertion of midline catheters, the ultrasound machine allows for treatment to be administered or procedures to be carried out on the ward instead of in the theatre. This in turn cuts down the number of patients in theatre, leading to better and more efficient patient care and a reduction in delays to treatment.

Paediatric gym equipment

Your generous donations have funded a range of specialist gym equipment for the Paediatric Musculoskeletal team at York and Scarborough hospitals.

A range of items including a mini trampoline, a training ladder, a foam wobble cushion and a static bike are now being used to support young patients during their treatment, helping to reduce pain, improve mobility, and enhance overall quality of life.

Lucy Eggleston, Paediatric Physiotherapist, explained:

Children's physio equipment for Scarborough

Children with complex needs often require specialised therapy equipment to aid in their development and recovery. These needs can range from physical disabilities that require rehabilitation tools, to neurological conditions that need tailored sensory equipment.

Your donations have funded specialised children's therapy equipment, which plays a crucial role in supporting children with a wide range of physical, developmental, and neurological needs.

Rachel Emerson, Therapy Assistant, said:




Fitting out specialist rooms

- A **sensory room** provides a specialist room for patients with additional needs








Supporting relatives

Ways to leave a gift in your Will

If you would like to leave a gift in your Will, how you decide to support the charity is entirely up to you.

There are four main types of legacy you might wish to consider:

- Residuary legacy This is the remainder of your estate after all other gifts have been made. This is often a popular way to leave a legacy as all other gifts have been given first and it is expressed as a fraction of your estate so it retains its value over time. This can be anything from 1% to 100%.
- Pecuniary legacy This is a fixed amount of money left to the charity. The amount of money may fall due to inflation so we do advise you to review the amount regularly.
- Specific legacy This is a gift of a specific possession such as jewellery, antiques, land or buildings.
- Reversionary legacy This allows you to leave your estate to your dependants while they are living, but after they pass away it will revert to the charity. For example, you may leave your house to your first beneficiary but after their death, the house passes to the second beneficiary which could be the charity.

It's never an easy conversation to have to think about, but making a Will is one of the most important decisions you can make to help safeguard for family in the future.
