

Golden wedding anniversary inspires gift for renal patients

To celebrate his golden wedding anniversary with his wife Pauline, long-time dialysis patient Ray Gilpin asked his family and friends to help him fund new TVs to improve the comfort of fellow patients at York Hospital.

Ray's thoughtful gesture raised £1,050, sparking a wider campaign that ultimately gathered momentum raising £3,275 to help fund 13 hospital-grade televisions for the Renal Unit.

His kind gesture and passion to help others inspired the local community to offer their support:

- \star The Newton on Derwent Heritage Café, a weekly pop-up, donated £615
- * Stuart Barker contributed £610, raised in memory of his late wife Emma, who was also a Renal Unit patient.
- * The Minster Lions Club of York and Derwent Lions Club each gave £500, with Derwent's chairman, Ken Hardgrave, also receiving treatment.

The new TVs were installed in May 2025, bringing relief, entertainment, and comfort to patients during long dialysis sessions.

Mandy Jones, Renal Unit Service Manager, said:

The difference you've made

Ultrasound Scanner for Scarborough's Early Pregnancy Assessment Unit

Thanks to your donations, the Early Pregnancy Assessment Unit (EPAU) at Scarborough Hospital have purchased a scan machine. This will allow the team to offer a one stop service where the patient would receive their consultation, diagnosis and discuss a treatment plan all in one place without the need to wait for radiology appointments.

Not only does it ease the pressure on radiology services, but it also allows the gynaecology team to deliver timely, compassionate care when it is most needed.

Clare Jordan, Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist explained:

•6 This is an exciting opportunity to enhance the care we provide to patients. For the first time, we are able to carry out 3D internal ultrasound scans, a significant step forward in helping us assess certain gynaecological conditions.

Thank you again for helping us develop our service with this advanced technology, we are already seeing the positive impact it is making for our patients.



Relational counselling

Your generous donations have provided funding for Clare, Gastro-Intestinal Clinical Nurse Specialist, to complete a three-year advanced diploma in relational counselling, giving her the tools to offer deeper psychological support to patients and their families.

Thanks to the course, Clare now helps patients process life-changing diagnoses, manage the emotional impact of treatment, and feel supported through every stage of their cancer journey. Her new skills are already making a difference, and she plans to share her knowledge with colleagues and support the creation of a local patient group.







Quiet rooms for the Magnolia Centre

Two quiet rooms in the Magnolia Centre at York Hospital have been refurbished thanks to your generous donations.


Arts in hospitals
