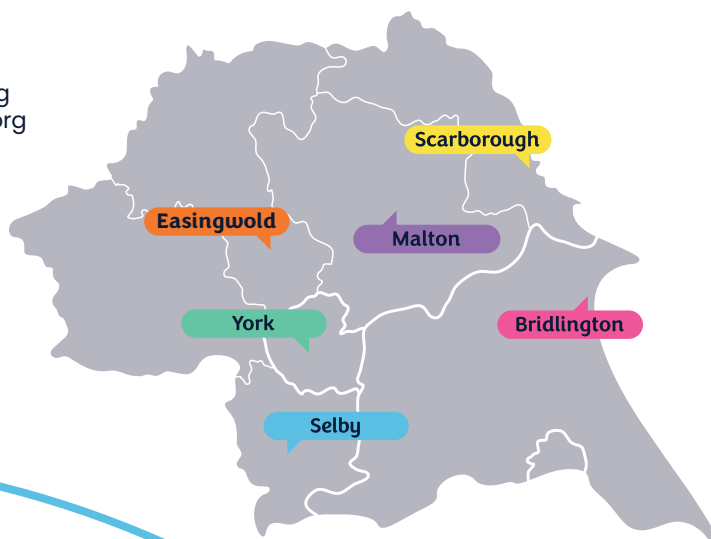

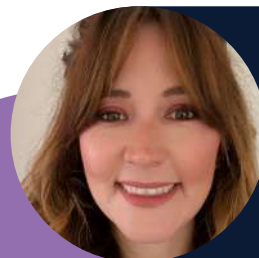

Tiny Lives Appeal

Every year, around 375 babies begin their lives in the Neonatal Unit at York Hospital. These are babies born prematurely or with health complications. Babies who need specialist care, and families who need comfort, reassurance, and support during one of the most challenging times of their lives.

The Neonatal Unit, previously known as the Special Care Baby Unit (SCBU), is undergoing a £2 million refurbishment to create a state-of-the-art space for babies and better facilities for families. Through the Tiny Lives Appeal, we aim to raise £100,000 to fund extra equipment and furnishings that will make the unit a calmer, more comforting, and family-friendly space.

The Neonatal Unit already delivers vital clinical care. Your support will help create an environment for families that matches the compassionate care delivered by the dedicated team. With your help, we can fund:

-  **Reclining chairs** so parents can stay close to their baby, day and night
-  **Twin cots** so twins can be together from the start, supporting bonding and emotional wellbeing
-  **Height-adjustable cots** to support mothers recovering from C-sections, helping them care for their babies with ease and dignity
-  **Comfortable furniture** to create a space where families can relax and feel at home
-  **Therapeutic skylights** to soften the clinical environment and bring a sense of calm to the unit

These upgrades will create a calm and comforting space that supports families emotionally and physically. They will help parents feel closer to their babies, reduce stress, and encourage connection.

The impact of your gift

Your donation to the Tiny Lives Appeal will help to create a space where families feel safe, supported, and cared for. An environment that reflects the exceptional care provided by the Neonatal Unit team.

Together we can build a brighter, more comfortable future for our smallest patients and their families.



Should the Tiny Lives Appeal exceed its target, any additional monies raised will be used to further enhance the neonatal care provision at York Hospital.

Should the appeal not reach the required target, York & Scarborough Hospitals Charity will ensure that donations are spent in accordance with its charitable objects. Funds raised will be prioritised to enhance the neonatal care provision at York Hospital.

York & Scarborough Hospitals Charity reserves the right to revise the Tiny Lives Appeal target, should the expected costs of the project exceed initial estimates. The target of £100,000 was set based on best estimates of project costings available in October 2025.



The difference you've made

The new Dandelion Room in Ward 36 brings joy to patients, visitors and staff.

The Dandelion Room on Ward 36 was previously an underutilised space. The Corporate Improvement Team worked closely with ward staff to explore how the room could be better used to support patient care and staff wellbeing. Alongside several smaller improvement projects on the ward, the room was identified for repurposing to better fit with ward priorities and enhance the overall ward environment.

To mark the transformation, the team held a competition to name the room. The name Dandelion was chosen for its symbolism of resilience, survival and healing, with Joanna Bowe, Health Care Support Worker, coming up with the chosen name. The room was given a full repaint before Joanna and fellow Health Care Support Worker Jason created a beautiful hand-painted mural featuring Clifford's Tower, dandelions and bees.

The refurbished room now provides a welcoming and calming space where patients can watch television or spend time talking, and where families can join their loved ones. It also offers clinical staff a private, comfortable area to hold meaningful or difficult conversations with patients and their families.

Vicky Davey, Sister on Ward 36, said:

“The room was completely unusable beforehand. It was full of old posters, had no furniture, and was mainly used for storage. We are extremely grateful to the Corporate Improvement Team for their support and to York & Scarborough Hospitals Charity for funding the refurbishment. It really will make a huge difference to both patients and staff.”

She added: “Joanna and Jason have done a fantastic job with the mural, and it really makes the room feel warm and homely.”



Organ Donation Gift of Life event

Thanks to generous donations, the Critical Care team at Scarborough Hospital was able to host a Organ Donation Gift of Life event during Organ Donation Week. The event honoured families whose loved ones had donated their organs, incredible gifts that have helped many people live longer, healthier lives.

Each family received a personalised candle with their loved one's name, which was presented in an organza bag as a keepsake. Homemade treats, tea and coffee were also served, creating a warm and reflective atmosphere.



Specialist cups for Speech and Language Therapy patients

Thanks to support from York & Scarborough Hospitals Charity and Scarborough Hospital League of Friends, the Speech and Language Therapy team at Scarborough Hospital have been able to purchase specialist cups to support inpatients and patients in the community.

Molly Reeve, Senior Speech and Language Therapist, explained:

“The nosey cup with handles is specially designed with a cut-out for the nose, allowing for easy drinking without the need to tilt your head back, ensuring comfort and reducing strain.

It is equipped with two sturdy handles proving a secure grip and allows for easy controlled use with both hands, ideal for individuals with limited hand strength or dexterity.”

Ways to leave a gift in your Will

If you would like to leave a gift in your Will, how you decide to support the charity is entirely up to you.

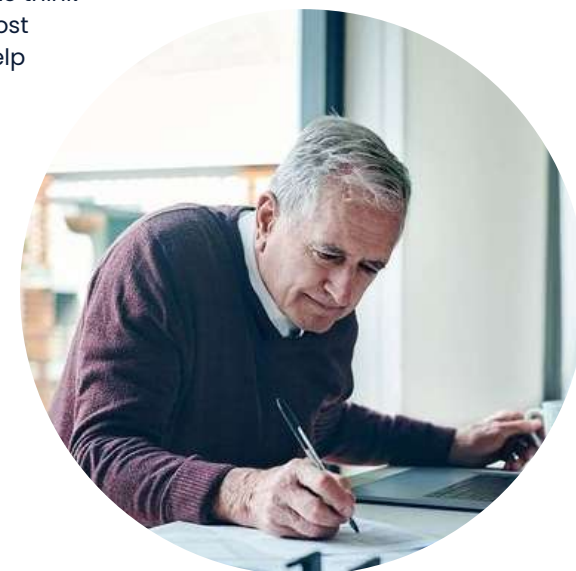
There are four main types of legacy you might wish to consider:

-  **Residuary legacy** – This is the remainder of your estate after all other gifts have been made. This is often a popular way to leave a legacy as all other gifts have been given first and it is expressed as a fraction of your estate so it retains its value over time. This can be anything from 1% to 100%.
-  **Pecuniary legacy** – This is a fixed amount of money left to the charity. The amount of money may fall due to inflation so we do advise you to review the amount regularly.
-  **Specific legacy** – This is a gift of a specific possession such as jewellery, antiques, land or buildings.
-  **Reversionary legacy** – This allows you to leave your estate to your dependants while they are living, but after they pass away it will revert to the charity. For example, you may leave your house to your first beneficiary but after their death, the house passes to the second beneficiary which could be the charity.

It's never an easy conversation to have to think about, but making a Will is one of the most important decisions you can make to help safeguard for family in the future.
